ACADEMIC AND PROFESSIONAL SNAPSHOT

I am **post-doc research fellow at the School of International Studies at the University of Trento**. I completed my academic training at **Cardiff University** School of Social Sciences, where I earned a **BSc in Social Science** (BPS accredited) and secured an ESRC 1+3 fellowship to pursue an **MSc in Social Science Research Methods** and a **PhD in Sociology**.

Following a brief research position at the Turin Polytechnical University, I joined the University of Trento in May 2019 as a postdoctoral fellow and then **Assistant Professor (RTDA)**. **I am currently the holder of the course ‘Everyday Life and Social Transformation’** (BA Sociology) and have **previously taught ‘Qualitative Research Methods’** (MA Global and Local Studies).

I hold the **National Scientific Qualification (ASN)** as an **Associate Professor in the academic fields 14/C1 (General Sociology)** and **14/D1 (Sociology of Economic, Labour, Environmental, and Territorial Processes)**.

I am highly involved in outreach activities. Recently, I have **collaborated with local institutions and actors, such as MUSE—Museo di Scienze Naturali di Trento, Comune di Trento, and Comune di Rovereto**, to promote just transitions through **participatory practices**.

I am actively engaged in **research networks**, including the **CoACT (Collective Action, Change, and Transition)** unit at the Department of Sociology and Social Research, University of Trento, and the **Politics, Ontologies, Ecology (POE) research network**, based at the Scuola Normale Superiore, which I co-founded.

My monograph *Everyday Life Ecologies: Sustainability, Crisis, Resistance* has been published by Lexington Books (Rowman and Littlefield) in 2023 and has been recently translated into Korean. I contributed to volumes published, among others, by Palgrave, Edward Elgar, Routledge, Il Mulino.

I serve on the ***ecofeminism* editorial board of the journal *Capitalism Nature Socialism***. I have published in **leading journals in sociology and qualitative research**, such as *Ethnography*, *Current Sociology*, *Environmental Values*, *Journal of Sustainable Production and Consumption*, *Rassegna Italiana di Sociologia*.

Research interests

My research interests lie in the field of **general sociology**, with a focus on **innovative and rigorous qualitative methodologies** to understand present **socio-ecological challenges and social transformations**. I theoretically and empirically explore **everyday life, social movements and socio-technical innovation in times of multiple and intersecting (social, climate, economic, political) crises**. I draw, among others, on the contributions of political ecology, feminism, Marxism, post-structuralist theories and methods, Science and Technology Studies (STS) and psychosocial approaches. I employ **multimodal integrated methodologies** to address complex societal issues.

RESEARCH ACTIVITIES

Below are described the specific research activities that I have been engaged in along my academic career path.

2025 (ongoing)

As part of my new appointment as post-doctoral research fellow in the Horizon EU project "RETOOL", I am personally curating research on "climate emotions" and "climate democracy" in the context of contemporary climate justice movements. Working in 4 case-study countries (Italy, Austria, UK, Ireland), and with selected activist groups, I am designing **participatory research** that starts from a collective mapping of the groups' "territories of existence" to **explore emotions and prefigurative democratic practices in climate justice activism**. I am also organising a **Living Lab** in the city of Trento to favour the creation of a permanent Climate Citizens' Assembly.

2022 – 2024

As part of my RTDA, I have developed two main lines of research centred **on investigating everyday consumption to promote sustainable communities**. These efforts have culminated in two submitted research projects:

- **ERC Starting Grant 2025: JUSTMEAT?** Cultured meat. Anthropocene challenges and the opportunities for just and sustainable food transitions (awaiting response).
- **Fulbright Scholarship** – Research Scholar All Disciplines: A sustainable food transition for the Anthropocene? Cell-based meat, public controversies, and the prospect of food justice between the US and Italy, in collaboration with Prof. Julie Guthman, UC Santa Cruz (project suitable for funding).

A) Cultured Meat and Food Innovation

I have focused on cultured meat across three axes:

- **Consumption.** In collaboration with the CIBIO Department at the University of Trento, my research group and I designed **four online focus groups** with informed consumers from across Italy to investigate “**consumption conventions**” around **cultured meat**. With a before-and-after design in which they were exposed to an infographics video made by colleagues from CIBIO, the focus groups were innovatively organised to also check for the effects of information provisioning on perceptions of cultured meat acceptability.
- **Scientific controversies.** Together with Dr. Niccolò Bertuzzi (University of Parma), we conducted a seminal study based on **30 semi-structured interviews** with actors across Italy, to understand the **science-public controversies** emerging around cultured meat in Italy – in the wake of the 2023 law banning “synthetic products” from the market. Interviewing both scientists and members of social movements, associations and organisations with stakes in food innovation for sustainability, we analysed the **framing processes underlying acceptance or criticism of this food technology** (September 2023 – November 2024).
- **Theory.** I am considering the role of **cultured meat as part of environmental governance and innovation policies in the “Anthropocene”**, joining perspectives from feminist political ecology and STS with sociological insights on the bioeconomy (June 2023 – ongoing).

B) Eco-social innovation and governance of sustainable transitions

I have inquired into this topic via the case study **INDACO (Innovazione DigitAle per il COmmercio elettronico trentino)**: a project emerging from a public-private partnership in Trentino for the development of a sustainable platform for e-commerce (Province, University, Trentino third sector and businesses). Also thanks to a 6-month internship based at one of the project partners’, I conducted **an ethnography of the organisation** that included **participant observation, netnography, 8 semi-structured interviews with key stakeholders and two focus groups with clients**. The objective was to study the research and implementation process relating to this platform, with a focus on how governance processes and the socio-economic context do or do not favour sustainable and just forms of transition in digitalisation processes.

June – August 2021

Diversity of food system and sustainability

Albeit working briefly for the project FOOdIVERSE due to maternity leave, I worked on **the multi-level analysis of food systems and their governance**, to investigate how they promote or hinder diversity: a key dimension for sustainability. I conducted a **literature review** and **theoretical elaboration** of key concepts. I also contributed to designing and analysing qualitative data from **focus groups with consumers and semi-structured interviews with key stakeholders in the province**.

May 2019 – June 2021

Socio-technical innovation and the sustainability of everyday practices

As part of the PLATEFORMS project, I was responsible for WP2, which produced and analysed qualitative data. I coordinated the research activities, conducting a large part of it. We completed **45 semi-ethnographic interviews** in people’s houses (and later online due to Covid-19 restrictions) to understand both **material and symbolic aspects of food provisioning**, as inspired by the theory of social practices. Through our **presence and collaboration with research subjects**, we collected **visual** (e.g., photographs, videos, digital walkthroughs) and **textual data** (e.g., interviews, field notes) **to analyse and interpret complex transformations of everyday practices with the advent of food platforms**. In this context, I explored issues related to gender, care and well-being in the digitalisation of ‘alternative’ food consumption.

In this period, I contributed to establish a collaboration between my Department and the **Occupy Climate Change project, led by Prof. Marco Armiero at KTH, Stockholm**. In particular, I supervised two undergraduate thesis working on the themes of the project, whose outputs have been

published in the “Atlas of other worlds” – an online map and repository of successful urban project of social innovation for sustainability.

October 2018 – January 2019

Mapping of socio-technical expertise

As part of a brief research appointment with the Polytechnical University of Turin, I went for a 2-months **period of research to the SICES (Sino-Italian Centre for Environmental Sustainability)**, an interdisciplinary centre involving 14 Italian universities and Tongji University, based at Tongji University (Shanghai, China). Via participant observation and interviews, **I conducted an extensive ethnography of the institution and of the subjects involved in its extended field**, to map actors, power relations and the potential for interdisciplinary research in view of a Sino-Italian collaboration on the objectives of “**sustainable urban transition**” for the city of Shanghai (see Master Plan *Shanghai 2035 - Striving for the excellent global city*). I coordinated and contributed to the writing of the case study report, and the organisation of a multi-stakeholder event.

S4T – Station for Transformation Project

Together with Prof. Francesca Forno, I represent the University of Trento in the EUI project “Station for Transformation,” led by the Municipality of Rovereto. This initiative by MUSE (Museum of Natural Sciences, Trento) explores the challenges and concepts of the Anthropocene in the context of natural sciences and museum practices. I participated in the first **expert standing group meeting** in May 2022 and have recently been invited to join the project’s **scientific committee**. A long-term goal is the development of the **“Cantiere Antropocene”**, an interdisciplinary research group focused on participatory assessments of socio-ecological issues in Trentino and the formulation of spatial policy recommendations in response to Anthropocene challenges.

Simulation of Citizens’ Assembly

I have been involved in this project (2022–2024) from its inception, in collaboration with Prof. Louisa Parks. Coordinated by MUSE and supported by Extinction Rebellion, the University of Trento, and the Municipality of Trento, it simulates deliberative democratic processes. As a **scientific committee** member, I contributed to **monitoring activities** and co-authored the **final report**.

Luigi Pellizzoni is full professor in Sociology of the environment and territory at Scuola Normale Superiore, Florence (Italy). His interests intersect three main themes, explored both empirically and in their implications for social and political theory: a) ecological crisis and sustainability; b) science, technology and innovation; c) social conflicts, participation and the transformation of governance. These issues are explored both empirically and in their implications for social and political theory. He has been involved in a number of national and international projects (Ministry of Research PRIN, EC FP4, 5, 6, Horizon and Interreg, EC JRC, WHO, Cariplo Foundation etc.) also as project and research unit PI.

He is active at international level as member and session organizer at general and thematic conferences and workshops of ISA (International Sociological Association), ESA (European Sociological Association), EASST (European Association for the Study of Science and Technology), 4S (Society for the Social Study of Science), ECPR (European Consortium for Political Research), STS-Italia (Italian association for science and technology studies), AIS (Italian Sociological Association), SISEC (Italian Society for Economic Sociology), SASE (Society for the Advancement of Socio-Economics), Research & Degrowth, Historical Materialism. In 1996, together with Giorgio Osti, he launched the National Conference of Environmental Sociology and has been member of the organizing committee of all editions (XIV edition, 2023).

In 2017 he has launched the research group and community of discussion 'POE-Politics Ontologies Ecologies' (www.poeweb.eu), of which he is the co-ordinator and which organizes an annual workshop on key and emergent topics (such as the re-emergence of limits, value and things, ontologies of care, new extractivisms, national variants in political ecology debate), symposia with international scholars and, since 2020, an international summer school, which he also co-ordinates. He has given lectures and keynote speeches at a number of institutions and international conferences and authored about 150 scientific publications. Emergent environmental and techno-scientific politics based on reframed ontologies and new forms of anticipatory governance in the framework of global environmental change are the focus of recent and ongoing research.
